# Advantages of Print Journals

- The library's print journals are excellent resources for medical students, but most are not available in electronic form.
- The print format may be easier to read.
- You can hold the entire issue in your hand and skim quickly.
- Your instructor may require a print journal.

- **Back issues are kept in the Medical area in alphabetical order by journal title, then by date.**
- **All journals are kept at least 5 years.**
- **This means there are more than 500 issues of journals.**
- **How do you find the one that has an article on your topic?**



# Databases to the Rescue!!

- A search of the databases will bring up the journal name and issue date for an article on a given topic.



- With this information, we can find the one issue we want out of the 500+ on the shelf.



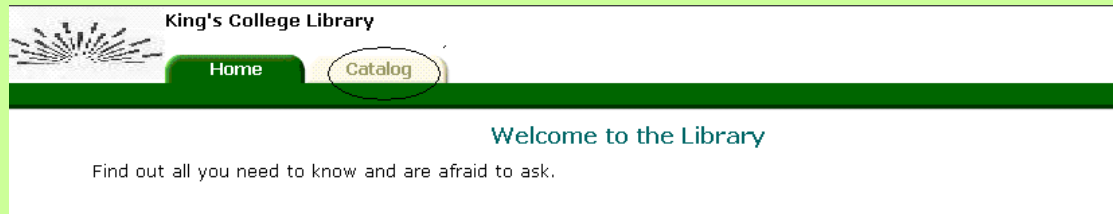
Since these journals are not included in any of the library's subscription databases, the library enters the main article titles for each issue, along with the journal name and date, into the library catalog.

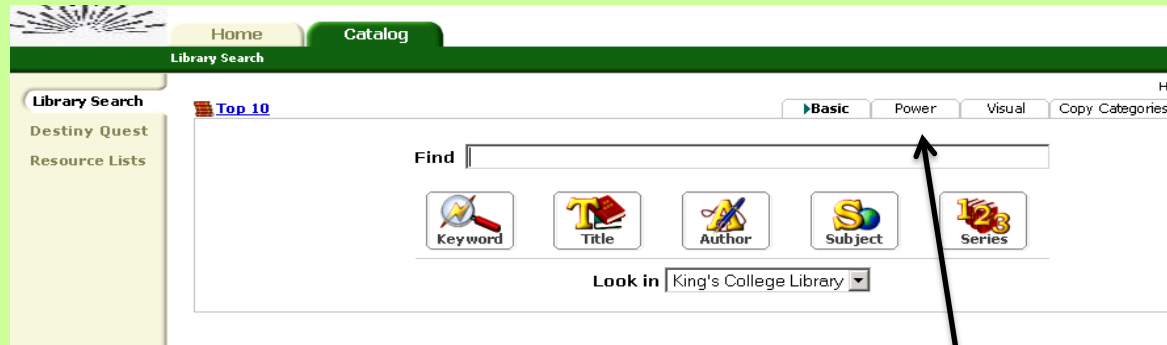
- Click on the Library icon on the desktop of any computer on campus. (Bottom left of desktop.)
- Click on the blue link for “King’s College Library.”



- Click on the “Catalog” tab as shown.



- Click on the “Power” tab.

- Go to the “Medical Journals” section of Periodical Backfiles.
- Find *Nursing Made Incredibly Easy* in its place alphabetically.
- Find the year 2004, then look for the March/April issue.



- Open the cover to the table of contents to find the page number for the article on hypertension.

The article on hypertension is on Page 12.

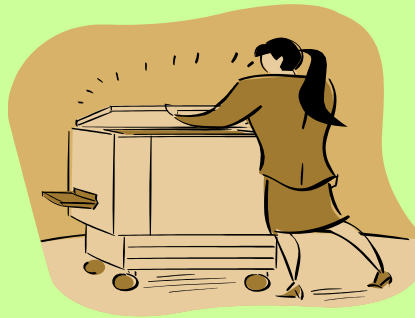
